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Dance

The Programme

The Dance Programme is designed to provide students with a practical and theoretical understanding of dance technique, education and industry. Although it is a very practical course, there are elements of theory in all units. The Performing Arts Scholarship is for students who actively want to be a part of the performing arts industry and have an interest in dance as a potential career pathway.

Dance scholars study BTEC Level 3 Performing Arts as an Extended Diploma (equivalent to three A-Levels) or Foundation Diploma (equivalent to one-and-a-half A-Levels), alongside other A-Levels and/or applied subjects.

The units and assignments in the Performing Arts Scholarship are tailor-made to guide students' in gaining experience of the specific roles within the dance industry. The programme is a positive progression in preparation for higher education or a professional setting.

Students are required to have previously undertaken some form of dance training, whether that be in school or through a private dance school. Students must be open minded and resilient, with a positive attitude towards learning new styles and concepts. It is important all students have a clear understanding of dance technique, performance and be prepared for all aspects of the scholarship.

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Drama

The Programme

The Drama Programme is designed to provide students with a practical and theoretical understanding of drama theatre and the industry.

Although it is a very practical course, there are elements of theory that will deepen individuals dramatic understanding. The Performing Arts Scholarship is for students who actively want to be a part of the performing arts industry and have an interest in drama as a potential career pathway. The course covers a range of transferable skills such as teamwork, confidence, public speaking, time management and empathy, which would be vital for any career path.

Drama scholars study and engage in the Drama enrichment workshops alongside other A-Level and/ or applied subjects.

The units in the Performing Arts Scholarship allow students to develop their knowledge and skills as an actor, designer and director. Students will also have the opportunity to gain in depth industry experience in directing others and performing in a number of productions to a paying audience.

The Performing Arts Scholarship does not require students to have previously complete any formal training or have any previous drama experience. However, the programme requires students to be passionate about Drama, understanding their is a requirement to preform to an audience and be open to working as part of a team. Students need to be open minded and resilient, with a positive attitude towards learning new styles. Students must also be prepared to attend evening rehearsals and performances.
