An Audience with Tim Peake

Dreams and aspirations are a huge part of the work that we do at Sir Thomas Wharton Academy. Our inaugural "Audience with" event with astronaut Tim Peake was designed to spark the imagination of our students, and it certainly didn't disappoint!

Local Primary schools, along with MLT academies, joined our amazing STEM club students for an afternoon of hands-on STEM activities and competitions along with shared letters written to Tim about the dreams and aspirations of our students.

Tim became the first British astronaut to visit the International Space Station and conduct a spacewalk during his mission. This is something that only a handful of people have ever had the opportunity to do, and Tim told us that this was the highlight of his mission. To bring the event to a close, Tim answered a wide range of interesting and thought-provoking questions from our students and was kind enough to have photos taken with students and staff.

We are proud to know that some of our students will talk about and never forget the "day they met a reallife astronaut"!

Easter Extravaganza

During the final week of term, we enjoyed our second family dining event to celebrate Easter. We enjoyed a picnic-style lunch, followed by an hour of tutor time activities that included a climate debate, writing a thank you card and playing bingo. Students were impeccably behaved and fully invested in the day's festivities!

Year 11 Geography Coasts Fieldwork Trip

Year 11 Geography students travelled to Flamborough, Hornsea and Mappleton as part of their GCSE course. Whilst on the visit students collected a range of data looking at the different coastal features as well as how the coastline is protected from erosion. The students were able to practice skills that will be assessed in their paper 3 exam as well as seeing landforms and features assessed in paper 1. As always, the students on the trip were a credit to the academy in the way they behaved and despite some initial nerves, they were able to approach members of the public with confidence to ask them to complete some questionnaires.
