National Curriculum:

What is the statutory core curriculum?

All students in KS4 must study; English, Mathematics, Science, PE, RS and Citezenship (Life Skills)

What is English Baccalaureate?

A suite of subjects that include; English, Mathematics, Science from the core curriculum along with History, Geography, Languages and Computer Science.

How many subjects do students need to do?

As a minimum, students will follow 8 subjects

What is the difference between GCSEs and Technical Awards?



They offer different assessment processes. Most GCSEs are assessed through terminal exams after 2 years. Technical Awards are assessed with a combination examinations and ongoing coursework. Furthermore, Technical Awards are tailored towards industry and specific vocations. There is no 'gold standard' and both are level 2 qualifications.

In this example, the student is selecting subjects that is quite narrowing as they are focused on ICT/ Computer Science. This is not an option as students need to select subjects that are of a variety and not 'duplicating' the skills and knowledge that they will learn.

These options are fine; however, they don't include any creative subjects. Students need to select wisely and consider how their choices could limit them in the future. Is this route specific to their desired career path?













Routes to 'Russell Group Universities':

'Russell Group' universities are a group of prestigious universities with a pedigree of producing **academic success** and scholastic excellence. Some of the universities that make up this group include Cambridge, Oxford, Edinburgh, Durham, Manchester, Sheffield, Liverpool, Leeds, Belfast and Birmingham.

The **English Baccalaureate** is a suite of subjects that are 'favorably' looked upon by Russell Group universities. Students following English Baccalaureate study, English, Mathematics, Science, Humanities (Geography or History) and Languages (French)

Research suggests that students who study the English Baccalaureate experience greater socio-economic mobility.

Furthermore, English Baccalaureate students are more likely to experience international travel and are exposed to cultural variety that increases employability.

Students who aspire to Russel Group universities should give serious consideration to selecting French as part of the option process.




