I would like to begin by thanking you for your continued support of the academy and for the important role you play in your children's education. Teaching and Learning

Year 13 UCAS Deadline

As of last week, all applications have now been processed by the sixth form team and have been submitted to UCAS ahead of the equal consideration deadline. We'd like to take this opportunity to reassure parents and students that this is completely normal as universities consider all applications received.

Tassomai

Students' investment in Tassomai continues to go above and beyond, with students in years 10 and 11 completing over 300 hours of quizzing and answering over 90,000 questions last week! French has also been added to our range of Tassomai subjects to support students' learning.

In year 11, we are running a number of rewards linked to Tassomai:

- If students answer 200,000 questions this month, they will win a photo booth at their Prom.
- The student who gains the most points between January and May will win a Prom VIP table.
- Students who achieve 1,000 points on Tassomai this week will be rewarded with the Ms Shaw Bookworm acadimal.

Sparx

As an academy, we have completed over 5,000 hours of personalised learning, answered a half a million questions correctly and over 270 students have improved their times table fluency this year. We thank every parent for their support and encouragement in completing Sparx mathematics tasks.

For years 7 to 10, homework is set every Friday and due the following Thursday.



Careers

Year 9 took part in their first activity day on Thursday 22 January, as part of the Access to Sheffield Programme. These students went on a visit to the University of Sheffield Campus. Through a campus tour, students started to understand the difference between a campus and city centre university. They used the 'Skills Builder' framework to develop themselves, as well as, learning about the 'Meta Method' utilising their metacognition to learn how they learn and think how they think, to better know themselves. This was a useful day that helped the students learn about their future potential.

ASK Apprenticeship visited the academy on Friday 23 January to support and inform students in year 11 to learn what apprenticeships are and what the different levels mean, as well as, the types of apprenticeships available and how to apply. This was a very informative event that will allow students in year 11 to make well informed decisions about their future.
