How does this year deliver your curriculum intent?

Over this year, students will cover Unit 2 – On-Screen Database Exam and Unit 3 – Social Media Project. Students will enhance their knowledge of key applications taught during their KS3/4 studies. During this course, students will develop cognitive and problem-solving skills such as critical thinking, problem solving and creating solutions alongside interpersonal skills such as communicating, working collaboratively, self-management, adaptability and resilience. In both units, students shall acquire key technical skills which will help them to become highly recruitable for a variety of job sectors. At the end of this academic year, Y12 students will be introduced to the Y13 written examination unit. This will allow students to prepare revision materials to secure a strong starting point in Y13.
