### **Athletics Championships**

On Monday and Tuesday, the PE department had the pleasure of taking our Year 7 and 8 (Monday) and Year 9 and 10 (Tuesday) athletics teams to the Keepmoat athletics stadium for the annual Doncaster and District Athletics Competition. Seventeen schools were in attendance over the two days, all competing in track and field events. We were so proud of our students who were amazing; they fully supported each other throughout the day, waited patiently in the stands for their event and gave 100% effort on their event. We could not commend them highly enough; they were an absolute joy to be with. Over the two days, it was our Year 8 Boys and Year 10 Boys team who achieved the highest number of points for our academy. They both came overall 4<sup>th</sup> place in Doncaster. Year 7 Girls, Year 8 Girls, Year 9 Girls, and Boys teams all came in 7<sup>th</sup> place.

### Yorkshire County Cricket Club Visit

On Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> June 2023, the PE department took a group of 30 students to Headingley Stadium to watch Yorkshire Vikings vs. Northamptonshire Steelbacks in the T20 Blast.
