On Thursday this week, the Year 11 Geography cohort visited the Holderness Coast as part of their required fieldwork visits. The visit included stops at Flamborough and Mappleton to support Paper 1 content on coastal landforms and processes. The focus of the day was to look at the effectiveness of the coastal defences at Hornsea. The data collected from a range of activities will allow students to effectively respond to questions in their paper 3 examination.

Students will have learnt a range of skills on the day and looked at the impacts of longshore drift, coastal management strategies as well as identifying how stakeholders are impacted by the use of coastal protection. This was a wonderful opportunity for students to experience geography beyond the classroom.
